#### **Publications**

I have received notification of the following new publications (available from Marnie Pope in Tasmania):-

"Alluvial Gold in Tasmania" byR. S. Botteri. (Mineral Resources of Tasmania 11)

This publication contains 28 pages (no photographs). This contains a brief description of the main deposits and a reference to all known deposits. (cost \$8 + postage)

"Created From Chaos – a geological trail of 100 sites in Tasmania" by Peter S. Manchester.

This book contains 304 including colour photos and illustrations.

This book is a must for anyone interested in geology who visits Tasmania. It is written in an easy to read style. The book lists 24 unique geological features which differentiate Tasmania from the rest of the world. It then describes 100 geological sites. You don't have to read the whole book, but just the 2 to 6 pages of the site that interests you – whether it be Russel Falls (chaos site 52) or Beaconsfield gold mines (chaos site 5) or Cradle Mountain (chaos site 68). The book describes what you see (often with illustrations pointing out the various features), how it was formed, how old it is, how old the rocks are etc.

It answers various questions such as What is dolerite? (p192), How the Newdegate Cave was formed? (p175), How did Lake St Claire establish its shape? (p287), Why do the granites produce topaz? (at Killiecrankie Bay, p296). (cost \$50 + postage)
